Unprecedented; ECI curtails WB campaigning after Kolkata violence

NEW DELHI: In first such action in India's electoral history, the Election Commission on Wednesday ordered campaigning in nine West Bengal constituencies to end at 10 PM on Thursday, a day before its scheduled deadline, in the wake of violence between BJP and TMC workers in Kolkata.

In a hurriedly-convened press conference, Deputy Election Commissioner Chandra Bhushan Kumar said it was for the first time that such an action has been taken using constitutional powers of the poll panel.

The Election Commission (EC) also ordered the

removal of Principal Secretary (Home) Atri Bhattacharya and Additional Director General, CID, Rajiv Kumar from their postings in West Bengal.

The EC's action came a day after parts of Kolkata witnessed wide-spread violence during BJP president Amit Shah's massive road show in Kolkata. A bust of 19th century Bengali icon Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar was also vandalised during the violence.

"This is for the first time such a measure has been taken using the EC's constitutional powers. But this is not going to be the last," Kumar said, referring to curtailment of campaigning

period.

The EC also expressed "deep anguish" over the vandalism of the bust and hope that the culprits will be arrested soon.

The EC invoked Article 324 of the Constitution to curtail the campaigning for the last phase of the election on May 19.

The constituencies where campaigning has been curtailed are -- Dum Dum, Barasat, Basirhat, Jaynagar, Mathurapur, Diamond Harbour, Jadavpur, Kolkata Dakshin and Kolkata Uttar.

The order on curtailment of the campaigning was signed by Chief

Six-member SIT constituted

Girl who visited Sushil's flat mentioned his wife's name in entry register

JAMMU: Making the investigations into the mysterious death of 2004 batch KAS officer Sushil Attri more complicated, the girl, who reportedly visited the Ansal Grace Apartments near Sainik Colony here to meet him, had identified herself as Jyoti Attri, wife of Sushil Attri in the register at the Guard Room.

The visiting girl did so to hide her identity while the guard on duty described the girl as slim and tall.

"She had covered her head and face with Duppata. She returned within three to four minutes, screaming and shouting 'he is dead... he is dead...'", the security guard on duty said, adding "The girl kept both hands on head, started her scooty and left the place."

Police has seized the entry register and also taken into possession the CCTV footage.

Today, Sushil's post-mortem was conducted, the report of which is awaited.

Family demands CBI probe

JAMMU: The family members and relatives of Sushil Kumar Attri on Wednesday alleged conspiracy into his death and sought the case to be transferred to Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI).

After performing last rites, the relatives and friends of the officer staged protests and blocked the Jammu-Pathankot National Highway.

"Why police is not showing us the CCTV footage," the family asked while protesting near Shastri Nagar Cremation Ground.

Senior police officers reached the spot and defused the situation by assuring fair investigation into the case.

Board of Doctors (BoD) was constituted at GMC Hospital Jammu to conduct post-mortem. The Board comprised of Dr Vishali Kotwal, Associate Professor, Medicine, Dr Shivani Mehta, Lecturer, Forensic Medicine, Dr Bharti Thaker, Lecturer Pathology and Dr Talib Hussain, Lecturer, Surgery. Preliminary report suggested that Sushil Attri died of hanging. However, police is waiting for the final report. Meanwhile, SSP Jammu Tejinder Singh has
